

## **Information re Fairfield Road traffic from City staff**

**April 29, 2021**

The City has continued to measure traffic volumes on Fairfield Road and they are well within thresholds for expected volumes on a collector road.

Investing in Richardson Street does not mean that the City will not continue to make safety and streetscape improvements on Fairfield Road as well as other local streets around the neighbourhood.

For example, on Fairfield Road, the City recently completed three crosswalk upgrades (Foul Bay Road, Kipling Street and Lilian Road) and two new speed reader boards are also being installed in late Spring 2021.

Traffic calming medians have already been installed on Fairfield Road at Irving Road and staff are in the planning stage for another installation at Fairfield Road at Memorial Drive. Further west on the corridor, accessibility upgrades on Fairfield Road @ Quadra Street and on Fairfield Road @ Rupert Terrace in tandem with road re-paving, are planned. There has also been a recent installation of an advanced left turn signal at the Fairfield Road and Cook Street intersection and staff are planning for a future traffic signal at St. Charles Street and Fairfield Road.

Roads are not static - we will continue to invest in crosswalks, sidewalks, transit stops, and passenger zones - all the while supporting new public EV charging stations, accessible parking stalls and shared mobility like car share.
