Strong neighbourhoods are important to the health and well-being of our whole city. When neighbourhoods thrive, the people who live there thrive too. Neighbour Day in Victoria started in May 2017 to celebrate our strong and caring communities. The pandemic created a situation where knowing and helping your neighbours was a necessary part of keeping our community strong and working together. On Neighbour Day, we invite you to meet and greet the people with whom you share your fences and walls. Do whatever feels right for you. Knock on a door for the first time, wave, lend a helping hand, share something, visit, throw a party—anything goes, as long as it involves you and the people in your building or on your street.

Contributing to Reconciliation

On March 24, Council approved a motion to establish an opportunity for property taxpayers to pay a voluntary additional amount with their tax payment to be directed to the Songhees and Esquimalt Nations (e.g., 5%, 10%) as a reconciliation contribution. Council previously approved a \$200,000 annual reconciliation grant from the City to the two First Nations on a trial basis for five years commencing in 2022. 2022 Get Growing, Victoria!

Get Growing, Victoria! supports communities in need. Through partnerships with non-profit organizations, we are distributing seedlings to residents who are facing barriers to growing their own food. Many partner organizations support communities directly through their programs, like horticultural therapy for mental health support groups, and gardening and food access programs for community kitchens that support people with disabilities. The pandemic has exacerbated the need for more support and resources to help communities foster social and emotional well-being in safe ways. Spring distribution dates for summer crops will occur **May 16 to June 5**. Later summer distribution dates for fall/winter crops will occur **July 25 to August 14**. Residents Invited to Get Involved in City of Victoria's Governance Review

The City has engaged MNP (a consulting firm) to conduct a governance review for the City. Governance involves the structures and processes for decision making, focusing on openness and accountability. It's about the City's leadership and responsibility to residents. It includes understanding residents' needs and making decisions in the best interests of the city. The goal of the review is to provide Council with recommendations for changes to any key bylaws, policies and guidelines and to support best practices for

efficient, effective and inclusive governance. The public is invited to get involved by completing a 10-minute online survey or attending a public event. MNP will also be meeting with representatives of groups with an interest in business, planning and development and community well-being.
